You can begin arriving at camp at 4 p.m. on Friday, June 24th (out of respect for the previous camp, please do not arrive early).

Check-in at the **main (lower) gate** (watch for signs). To help expedite the check-in process, remember to pay all camp fees by June 15. It is necessary for all campers (even for a night) to be registered. Sandwiches will be served Friday night 5:30-6:15 p.m. Our opening service will begin at 7:15 p.m. in the Tabernacle.

New this year in keeping with Lake Doniphan Covid safety guidelines:

- Please monitor your temperature for 10 days before camp and take extra precautions to remain healthy.
- A health screening form is required for each person. One form is included in this mailing. Make copies of the form for each family member or download copies of the form at <http://cmmccommunity.org/announcements.html>. These forms will be turned in to the camp doctor/nurse when you arrive at camp.
- Lake Doniphan has a Waiver and Release of Liability form that must be signed for each person (camper or guest) participating in Family Camp. This will be available when you arrive at camp, or you may download it at <http://cmmccommunity.org/announcements.html> and bring it with you to camp.

The **Covid safety protocol set by Lake Doniphan** that will need to be followed at Family Camp will depend on the level of risk at the time of camp. New case numbers have been on the rise recently so even though our area is currently in the low/medium risk categories, things may change by the beginning of camp.

At all levels –

- regular hand washing or use of hand sanitizer
- wash hands or use hand sanitizer before entering dining room
- outdoor dining option will be available
- do not attend meals, services, or activities if not feeling well
- frequent cleaning of commonly touched surfaces

At low (green) or medium (yellow) risk levels, protocol will include –

- masks are encouraged indoors but not required
- cohorts are not required
- daily temperature checks are encouraged

At the higher (orange) risk level, protocol will include –

- masks required indoors
- physical distancing while in meal line
- cohort groups for seating at meals and worship services
- two meal times
- no self-serve food bars or drinks
- daily temperature checks required
- no guests in lodging areas

Please bring masks to camp in case they are needed.

Bring to camp:

- EVERYONE needs to bring BEDDING & TOWELS. Lodge (full sheets), cabins (twin sheets), mini-lodge (extra long twin sheets).
- Scriptures
- Insect repellent and sunscreen.
- Fishing equipment, outdoor and indoor games. Music instruments for worship. (For everyone's safety, please leave bicycles, scooters and skateboards at home).

Things to remember:

- Please be on time for meals so that our KP workers will also be able to attend all of our services.
- We will need 3-4 adult KP volunteers per meal to help the supervisors with wiping tables, putting up chairs, etc. (Please arrive 15 minutes before the meal). Individuals will be responsible for picking up their drinks and returning dishes to the dish room window.
- Please leave all dishes/glasses/silverware in the dining room.
- **Ice, water, tea, and lemonade** are available any time in the dining hall. Please bring your own cup or use the disposal cups provided.
- The adult general class will be studying *Living Jesus...Living Peace*. Copies will be available at camp, or you can download a copy at <http://cmmccommunity.org/announcements.html>
- Please drive slowly (5 mph) and park your vehicle in one of the designated areas. Please do not park or drive on the grass. Remember to keep the road at the entrances of the Lodge open except when unloading or loading your vehicle.
- Since Lake Doniphan is not responsible for loss, theft or vandalism, lock your car and leave personal items in the trunk.
- Dress should be governed by good taste. Informal attire is appropriate for all activities.
- Wear **shoes** and your **name tag** at all times.
- Give lost and found items to the camp directors.
- Alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, weapons, fireworks and explosives are prohibited. Smoking or use of tobacco products is not allowed in any building.
- The **first-aid room** is located in the NE Lower Lodge. Please bring your personal medications including aspirin. Our camp doctor is Jenni Blair.
- Sorry, pets are not allowed on the campgrounds.

- Ages 19 and under must be housed in the same or adjacent housing and be responsible to parents or an adult sponsor. Adult sponsors may only sponsor two children and youth.
- Parents, grandparents, and sponsors are responsible for the safety and conduct of their children. Remember that all bodies of water are off-limits to children without adult supervision. Children 14 and under must have an adult with them for fishing. Use the buddy system at the lake and pool.
- Lifeguards will be at the **swimming pool** during designated hours. Cutoffs create problems for the pool filter and cannot be allowed. No running at the pool; strictly adhere to the instructions of the lifeguards.
- Please respect our **quiet times** (1:15-2 p.m. and 11 p.m.-6 a.m. daily)
- In case of a **Fire or other Emergency**: the air horn signal will be three blasts repeatedly. Campers should walk quickly to the canteen parking lot and line up with your family or sponsor while we await further instructions.
- The air horn will blow non-stop in case of a **Tornado Warning**. The Lower Lodge hallways and storage areas are the best shelters. If you cannot make it there, go to the Mini-Lodge hallways or the closest bathhouse.
- Please consult with Tracy and Sharon before you move any furniture!!
- While this is not a closed camp, we do not encourage guests coming to the campgrounds except for the baptismal services. **Guests** will need to check in with the camp doctor upon arrival, complete a health form, and should remain outside of the buildings as much as possible. Those not attending Family Camp will be able to keep in touch with what is happening at camp on the mission center Facebook page.
- To help keep everyone healthy, leaving the campgrounds during Family Camp is discouraged unless absolutely necessary. If needed, one person will make a trip into Excelsior Springs daily to pick up items that campers or teachers may need. Let Tracy or Sharon know if you need anything picked up. For those who do have to leave the campgrounds, please contact Mary Kidd before you leave and check in with her when you return. Also please take precautions while you are away from the campgrounds.
- *Registration fees cover only part of the actual camp costs. Please prayerfully consider the needs of the camp and the value of our time together as you make your offerings at the evening services.*

Clean-up Procedures for Everybody

- *Retrieve all your belongings
- *Bag all garbage and take it to a receptacle
- *Turn off the air conditioner.

If you need to leave camp early, contact Sharon to check your room.

At Camp This Year!

✦ Bring your fishing gear and get ready for the annual *Fishing Derby* from 2-4 pm on Sunday afternoon. This will be a great family event for everybody! (**Remember that all kids age 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult.**) Bring your catch for measuring to the shelter house by the lake by 4 pm.

✦ Older youth and adults will have an opportunity to create a unique individual 12x16-inch canvas painting in response to a guided spiritual practice. Mary Love will guide this *Art as a Spiritual Practice* using the principles and elements of design in response to selected scripture readings. Cost will be \$5 per person and is limited to 25 participants. ✦ **Boating** will be supervised by the lifeguards during designated hours (3-4:30 pm (weather permitting)). Life preservers are required for all boaters.

✦ **Chats** with John Wight will be held at 4 pm on Sunday in the Lower Lodge.

✦ **Talent Show** will be Sunday at 8:45 p.m. Talk to the Slaters to volunteer.

✦ Two new things with the **Canteen** this year! Signs with the food prices will be posted outside the canteen; however, it will be your responsibility to deposit money for the items you are buying in the canteen box. We are trying the honor system this year--please help your children understand that they will need to pay for the items they select. The canteen will be open both in the afternoon (3-4) as well as after the evening worship services.

✦ Be alert to natural hazards: poison ivy, poisonous snakes, spiders, skunks, etc. Watch for ticks and wear bug repellent. When hiking, stay on roads and trails; long pants, long sleeves and a hat are necessary if you're venturing into the woods or tall grass.
